Denmark

- **810.** Take a canal tour of Copenhagen, Denmark, a city that is rich in classical architecture, canals lined with boats, and bicycle-enthusiasts. It even houses a royal family. (The Danish monarchy is over 1000 years old.)
- **811.** See the <u>Changing of the Guard</u> at <u>Amalienborg</u>, the winter home of the Danish royal family, located in Copenhagen, Denmark. It consists of four identical classicizing palace façades with rococo interiors around an octagonal courtyard. (<u>Images</u>).

- **812.** Go to the Church of Our Saviour (Vor Frelsers Kirke), a baroque church in Copenhagen, most famous for its <u>corkscrew spire</u> with an external winding staircase that can be climbed to the top, offering extensive views over central Copenhagen.
- **813.** Go to the Ice Bar in Copenhagen. Everything--including the bar, tables, chairs, and glasses--is made of ice (you're given a parka so that you don't freeze).
- **814**. Visit <u>Christiana</u>, a semi-autonomous hippie community in Copenhagen (an example of alternative living).
- **815.** Go to <u>Tivoli Gardens</u>, a famous amusement park and pleasure garden in Copenhagen, Denmark (it's the second oldest amusement park in the world).
- **816.** Visit Egeskov Castle, located on the island of Funen (the third largest island in Denmark). It's Europe's best preserved Renaissance water castle. (Images).
- **817.** Go to <u>Hans Christian Andersen's</u> <u>house/museum</u> in Odense, Denmark (Odense is the main city on the island of Funen).
- **818**. Have an <u>open sandwich</u> (Smorrebrod) in Denmark. This traditional lunch consists of a piece of buttered rye bread with different toppings, including cheese, smoked fish, sliced tomatoes, eggs, and so on.
